Marriage Tip – Encouragement

“Death and life are in the power of the tongue,”
Proverbs 18:21.

Nothing can be more devastating than critical words... Nothing can be more uplifting than encouraging words. Never doubt the power of your words.

As one who has been married now for 24 years (to the most wonderful woman in the world), I’ve had plenty of opportunities to make mistakes. I’ve also had plenty of opportunities to learn from those mistakes. The mistakes I most often make are with my words. James 3:8 tells us that *“no one came tame the tongue.”*

One of the most difficult things for me to accept is that although my wife is wonderful, she is not perfect – and never will be. She’s unfortunately had to accept the same thing about me.

And it’s usually the little things that get us in trouble - cap left off the toothpaste, things not put back where they came from,

Marriage Tip: Always encourage/praise your spouse – especially in public. Never publicly criticize your spouse! Even words spoken jokingly can cut deep. For example, “yeah my wife burnt our dinner last night, you know it’s a wonder we are all still alive with the stuff we have to eat.” Another might be, “yep, the faucet’s still dripping, you know the police put a padlock on my husband’s toolbox for the protection of all mankind.” You know these things may get a laugh from others, but they do harm to the intended target.

On the other hand, words of praise will encourage each of us to do even better. Find something positive to say!
